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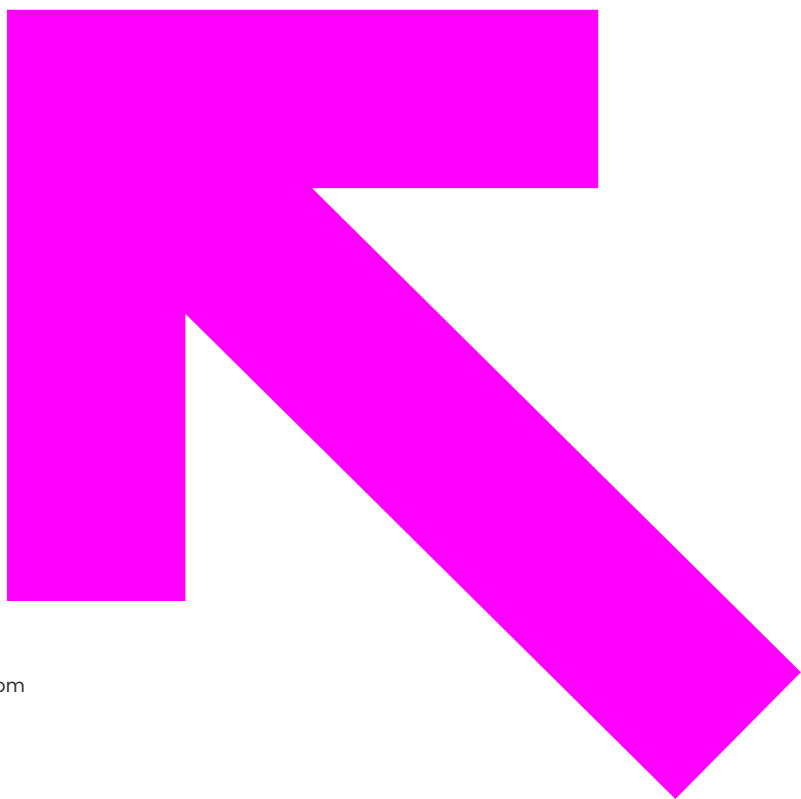
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Letter from the Director

Hi friends,

Sitting down to write another impact report I am honestly shocked by how much our movement has achieved.

Among so many highlights, it brings me such pride to reflect on the fierce, courageous, and determined campaigns we've waged together aiming to reinstate gender-affirming care for trans youth in Queensland, protect and expand trans health care, and protect the Sex Discrimination Act from the anti-trans lobby's attempts to weaken it.

Across these battlegrounds, our movement has mobilised tens of thousands of people to sign petitions, contact MPs, join open letters, organising local meetings, turn up to rallies, attend webinars, and, at one point, deliver a cardboard crocodile to the QLD Health Minister's office (you'll have to read August's update to find out more...).

Together, we have sent a clear message to our opponents: we are organised and ready to fight for the future that we deserve. While we have experienced some heartbreaking setbacks, and are facing an increasingly hostile political environment, I know that our movement is only going to grow more powerful and more vital in the year ahead.

The rise of the right and the mainstreaming of anti-trans politics is deeply concerning, but it is also something that we have been preparing our community for since 2023. The idea of the Trans Justice Project was formed almost four years ago. Seeing what was happening in the US and the UK we decided that something needed to be done to defend our community from what was coming.

The fact that since our founding in 2023, we have gone from a few social media accounts and a crowdfunder to a national organisation with action groups all over the country is, frankly, wild. But of course none of us have done this alone.

I want to acknowledge the hard-working volunteer organisers coordinating actions across the continent, and those that volunteer in our core team with admin, fundraising, logistics, training, and moderation. Also, our board members Liz Duck-Chong, CQ Quinan, and Jess Herne for all the late night meetings and out-of-hours work. I want to especially acknowledge Liz who has been working tirelessly behind the scenes on our trans health campaign, getting ethics approval, and consulting with community members all over the continent.

This year we welcomed so many new people into our movement. Both through our campaigns, new action groups, and through our training program.

This year, we invested deeply in training hosting Trans Justice Organising Trainings in Cairns, Brisbane, Sydney, and Canberra, Adelaide and Perth [with more locations coming]. Additionally, we decided to once more run our Trans Justice Organising Fellowship, training a cohort of 27 leaders from across the country in organising, strategy, and campaigning.

This has been a wonderful opportunity for me to get to meet so many leaders in-person, and connect with many more online.

I'm also proud of the work we are doing to create vibrant and welcoming spaces for trans and gender-diverse people. From community picnics to our newly launched City2Surf team (follow [QueerRunCBR](#) for more information), our movement has worked hard to create the kind of community that can be a place of joy and connection, as well as a place for action. I believe this is critical for sustaining ourselves for the long fight ahead.

On a personal note I want to mention that in late November, my dad, Graeme Turner, passed away. My dad dedicated his life to trying to make the world a better place, to hold power to account, and fight for the public good. He was a fierce warrior with a humility and warmth that I think a lot of people found disarming. But most importantly, he was a wonderful father to my sisters and I, and husband to my mum. He will be deeply, deeply missed.

I want to thank the board and staff for stepping up in my absence. My dad passed in the same month where things were heating up in Queensland, and they ensured that we were on-the-ground and active during such an important moment.

As I look toward 2027, I feel the weight of the challenges before us, but even more than that, I feel the strength of the community we are building together.

Thank you to every person who has donated, volunteered, organised, signed a petition, showed up, or stood alongside us in support of freedom and justice for all trans and gender diverse people in the past year.

Everything contained in this report is only possible because of all of us.

Shift the politics

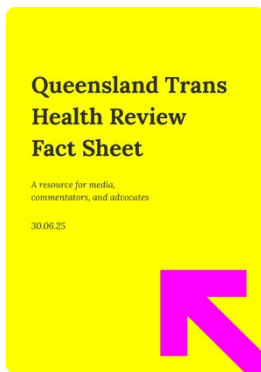

Exposing the QLD Government's Sham 'Review'



Queensland Trans Health Review Fact Sheet

In July 2025, we released the [Queensland Trans Health Review Fact Sheet](#), a powerful resource designed to equip media, commentators, and advocates with the facts they need to challenge the disinformation spread by our opponents. The fact sheet, authored by PhD candidate Freya Kerwick, exposed the false pretence put forward by the Queensland Government for their review of trans youth health care.



New t-shirts to wear our pride

We again partnered with the wonderful folks at [Sock Drawer Heroes](#) and artist [Judy Kuo](#) to launch our fresh "Trans Justice Now" tee. With a portion of the proceeds powering our movement, the shirts offer a simple, powerful way to show pride and support trans justice for our community and allies alike.

Fundraising to power our movement

In June 2025, we launched our End Of Financial Year fundraiser. More than 360 people chipped in over \$30,000 for our work, enabling us to scale up our campaigns fighting for freedom, justice and equality for trans and gender-diverse people.

Australian Progress' Leadership 2025 conference

Jackie attended Australian Progress's two-day Leadership 2025 conference in Canberra, on Ngannawal and Ngambri land. There she connected with progressive leaders from across the continent, updated the network on our work, and built alliances for future collaboration.



Our staff retreat: mapping the path forward

Our ordinarily remote team gathered together in-person in rural Queensland for three days for our staff retreat. We used the rare opportunity to be together to evaluate the past year, learn new skills, and build out our strategy for the year ahead.

 **August 2025**

Fighting to reinstate care in Queensland



Queensland Organising: Trans Youth Deserve to Thrive

In August our movement mobilised again — building upon momentum from our huge national rallies in February 2025.

We hired organiser Charlie Collins (they/them) from Cairns/Gimuy as our Queensland Organiser for eight weeks, to scale up our capacity and ramp up pressure on the Queensland Government to reinstate care in a critical moment.

Together, our movement dialled up the heat on the Queensland Health Minister Tim Nicholls with actions, protests, and local organising.

Over these eight weeks we:

- **Hosted two webinars** updating our community and supporters to engage and mobilise folks to take action. We had more than 100 people attend the online events.
- **Distributed thousands of leaflets** across Clayfield and 44 suburbs around Queensland, we brought attention to these attacks on trans youth health care.
- **Organised rock postering** across Brisbane.
- **Rallied outside Minister Nicholls' office** on Wear It Purple Day, calling for an overturn of the ban. Together, more than fifty of us were unmissable outside Nicholls' suburban office, holding placards and chanting.
- **Held a honk-in** outside Minister Nicholls office during peak hour traffic to ensure that his staff heard us loud and clear.
- **Held our 'Croc of Shit' action.** Cairns residents travelled to Tim Nicholls office (since he refused to meet with them) and delivered a cardboard crocodile to Nicholls' office, describing the ban as a 'croc of shit. They also delivered hundreds of postcards from people affected by the decision on the front window of Nicholls' office.



Showing solidarity and raising funds at City2Surf

At the start of the month, Jackie took on City2Surf as part of the Trans Justice Project team, in partnership with our friends at [QueerRunCBR](#). Together, we showed solidarity with the trans community at Sydney's iconic event, built new connections, and raised vital funds.

 September 2025

National Press Club address with Dr. Anna Cody



Jackie attended Sex Discrimination Commissioner, Dr Anna Cody's, National Press Club Address. Her address — themed *"All voices, equal futures: A vision for gender equality in Australia"* — identified the systems that perpetuate gender inequality, and called for leadership that reflects our diverse communities.

*"When we talk about gender equality, we must be clear that it means equal treatment of all genders, including trans and non-binary people. We reject the stigma that says trans people must hide who they are to be safe or accepted. **When we recognise trans rights, we recognise the worth and dignity of every person.**"* — excerpt from Dr. Anna Cody's National Press Club Address.



Showing up for for Palestinian human rights

The Trans Justice Project community joined nation-wide rallies for Palestinian justice across the year, including the record-breaking March For Humanity across the Sydney Harbour Bridge.



 **October 2025**

Uniting against hate with the Flying Bats FC and organising in Queensland



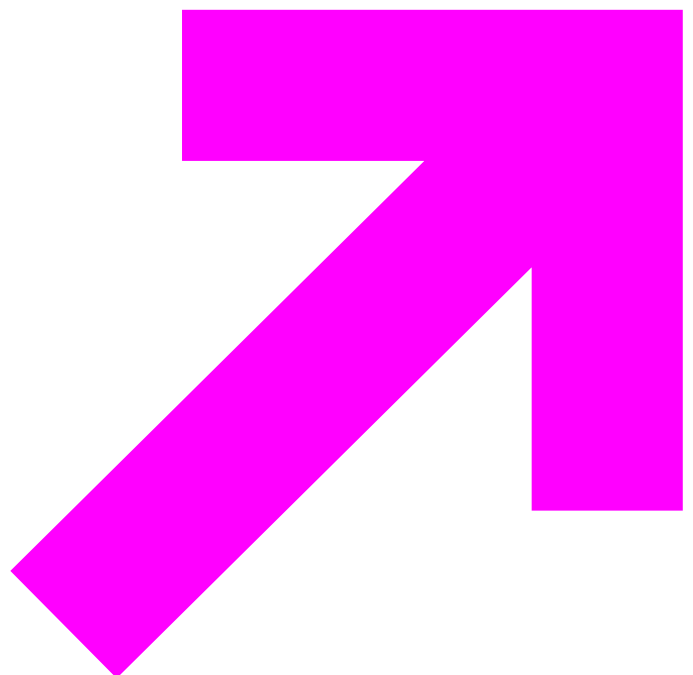
Supporting Flying Bats Football Club campaign

In October we were proud to support Flying Bats Football Club and Pride Cup to stand up to the vile targeting, harassment, and bullying of trans and gender-diverse football club members. We assisted the groups to launch a petition to Football Australia, with a demand to protect the participation of all women in football. Their campaign had huge reach and was even covered by ABC's 7:30 program.



TJP booth at PAX AU: Australia's biggest celebration of games and gaming culture

In October, Trans Justice Project volunteers in Melbourne managed a TJP booth at PAX AUS. The wonderful team at PAX AU generously offered the booth for free as part of the PAX Together Lounge and Theatre. Superstar Ellie led the team of volunteers across the three days, engaging thousands of PAX attendees to sign our petitions and join the movement.





Pushing Queensland to Reinstate Care for Trans Youth

At the end of October, a case was heard in the Queensland Supreme Court concerning a trans young person and their mother who had sued the Queensland government over its denial of gender affirming health care to trans youth.

On the day of hearings, Trans Justice Meanjin supported local queer activist group Magandjin People's Pride in holding a rally outside the Supreme court in support of the trans child and their mother.

On the day the judgement was handed down, Trans Justice Meanjin once again joined a number of local trans and queer organisations at a protest outside the Queensland Supreme Court, led by Jodie. The court ruled the directive to deny gender affirming healthcare was unlawful. Jodie joined LGBTI Legal Service and Equality Australia in providing comment to the news media.

Trans Justice Meanjin and Magandjin People's Pride called a snap protest for the next day to demand gender affirming healthcare immediately be reinstated in light of the court ruling.

Later that evening, Queensland Health Minister Tim Nicholls gave a ministerial directive to reinstate denial of access to gender affirming healthcare to trans youth. This was widely condemned as undermining the rule of law and separation of powers, and conflicting with human rights.

The next day's snap protest drew hundreds of people demanding care be reinstated in a powerful rejection of the Minister's decision. All speakers at the rally were local trans community members. Jodie provided comment to the media, saying of the Health Minister's Ministerial Directive to reinstate healthcare denial, *"This decision is disgusting, it's outrageous, and he should not have made it."*

November 2025

Celebrating Trans Awareness Week across the continent



Trans awareness week

In November we marked Trans Awareness Week with events across the continent celebrating trans pride and engaging the wider public in our movement for equality, freedom, and justice for trans and gender diverse people.

Canberra / Ngunnawal and Ngambri

As part of Trans Awareness Week, QueerRunCBR organised Pride Stride 2025: a group running, walking, and rolling event bringing the community together in solidarity and celebration.

Melbourne / Naarm

Jackie spoke at the launch of Rainbow Network's Celebrate Pride resource, which supports the organising of queer events for young people across Victoria.

Brisbane / Meanjin

In Brisbane, Trans Justice Meanjin organised a massive flag drop from Victoria Bridge, creating a powerful and visible show of support for the trans community.

Adelaide / Tarndanya

Trans Justice Adelaide hosted a Trans Joy Picnic, bringing together 50 attendees to celebrate trans community, connection, and joy.

Sydney / Gadigal

Trans Justice Sydney connected with the community by hosting a booth at TAFPI 2025: a joyful, empowering celebration of the trans and gender diverse community. The team also hosted a stall at the Sock Drawer Heroes markets on November 15, sharing resources and building support for trans justice.



Joint trans youth healthcare petition

Also in Brisbane, Digital Campaigner Jodie joined representatives from other trans and queer organisations to present a joint petition to the Queensland parliament demanding the reinstatement of gender affirming care for trans youth. The petition was signed by around 16,000 people.

Trans Day of Remembrance

On November 20th, TJP members marked Trans Day of Remembrance at services across the continent. Trans Day of Remembrance (TDOR) is an annual observance that honours the memory of the trans lives lost to acts of transphobia and discrimination, and calls for greater action to ensure the safety of trans and gender diverse people.

December 2025

Responding to Queensland's review of trans youth health care



In December, the Queensland government delivered their 'review' into gender affirming healthcare for trans youth. The government initially refused to release the report publicly.

We mobilised the call for the government to make it public because the public had a right to know the recommendations that were restricting our communities access to care.



After significant pressure from the Trans Justice Project and other trans and queer organisations the government capitulated, releasing the report and exposing the fact that the reviews recommendations were at odds with the actions of the Queensland Government.

This was an important victory. It shows that even the Government's own review panel couldn't find evidence to deny trans young people health care. This proves what we knew all along – that this decision was about politics, not about the wellbeing of young people and their families.



Ultimately, the Queensland government announced that the ministerial directive denying trans youth healthcare would be made indefinite, tying a review of the directive to results from the UK's 'Pathways' study on puberty blockers.

Shortly after, the **Northern Territory government** announced that it would also deny access to gender affirming healthcare to trans youth in a statement a few days before Christmas.

We are continuing to fight back against the restrictions on our health care and freedoms, and organising for a health care system that works for all of us.

January 2026

Our Annual General Meeting

Our Annual General Meeting for 2025 was held on January 13th. We used the meeting to review our financial plan for 2026, our topline strategy, and governance priorities for 2026.

February 2026

Launch of trans health campaign



Amidst rising attacks on gender-affirming care we began working on a proactive campaign to expand and protect our care.

In February, we launched the petition for our trans health campaign, calling on governments across the continent to invest in our community and commit to a plan that makes trans healthcare available to everyone who needs it.

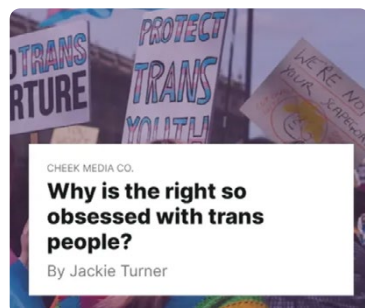

Protect our care from political attack

In July we are launching a community survey and will use the results to write a landmark report outlining a blueprint for a national trans health plan. Together, we will work to build public support for this plan through town halls, actions, and community conversations.

We have been working with Liz Duck-Chong and Dr Freya Kerwick on the survey, planning engagement, and consultations with community members and experts.

Trans Justice Project at Sydney Mardi Gras

Jackie spoke at an event organised by the UNSW Centre for Ideas and Sydney Mardi Gras alongside Kath Ebbs, Kate Rowe, and Mon Schafter. Trans Justice Sydney also took part in Mardi Gras celebrations, joining the parade with the Parents for Trans Youth Equity float on the final day of the festival, and hosting a booth in “Trans Camp” at Mardi Gras Fair Day 2026.

March 2026

Unveiling the world's largest trans flag



In March, Trans Justice Brisbane /Meanjin coordinated an extraordinary community project: creating and unveiling what became the world's largest trans flag.

They first organised a concert (held on 26 February) to raise more than \$2,500 to cover materials and venue costs. Then over 10 days, 30 community members came together to sew the 800-square-metre flag by hand.

The completed flag was unfurled in Davies Park in West End and attracted international media coverage. Coinciding with Trans Day of Visibility, the event called on the Queensland government to reinstate health care for trans youth.

Trans Day of Visibility

Trans Day of Visibility on March 20th was marked across the country with powerful moments of community, pride, and celebration.

In Boorloo/Perth, Queer Liberation Boorloo held a rally, Trans Justice Adelaide hosted a community panel bringing people together to reflect and connect, and Trans Justice Sydney organised a Community Storytelling Spectacular.

Increasing our fundraising capacity

In March, we were thrilled to welcome Cass and Stephen as volunteers, bringing their expertise and energy to strengthen our fundraising capacity. Their support has been invaluable in expanding our grant applications, donor outreach, and the long-term sustainability of our work.



International Women's Day with Inner City Legal Centre & UTS

We were excited to be part of the Inner City Legal Centre's (now infamous) event for International Women's Day: 'IWD - For and By Trans Women'. The event was later brought up in senate estimates by Senator Michaelia Cash where she incorrectly claimed that the event was organised by Trans Justice Project while holding up a photo of our Director, Jackie. Despite this negativity the event was a huge success with strong attendance and engaging sessions.

Our very own Jodie presented alongside Roxy Tickle and other incredible trans women on how the ICLC can support people when they are harassed online. Jackie also hosted a session on building people-power.

March 2026



Australian Progress conference in Melbourne / Naarm

Jackie, Jodie, Mel, Rory (Trans Justice Sydney), and Liz (Board member) — attended the Australian progress annual conference in Naarm, thanks to generous scholarship support. Across the event, the team took part in a wide range of panels, workshops, and conversations, building connections with organisers and civil society leaders from across the continent. A highlight was seeing the work of the Trans Justice Project recognised on the main stage, with Flying Bats Football Club Vice-President Sam Lewis giving TJP a powerful shout-out during a plenary session.



Trans Justice Sydney

Action group Trans Justice Sydney has been extremely active over the past year with numerous events, stalls, and submissions on issues impacting trans and gender diverse people in NSW. To get involved find them on [instagram](#) and signup for updates.

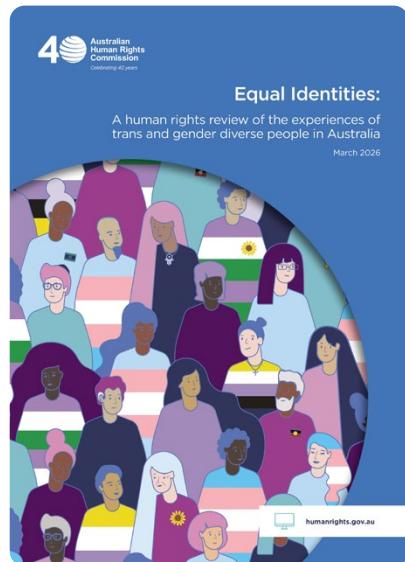

 **April 2026**

Turning research into action: bringing the Equal Identities report to decision-makers



At the start of April, we were honoured to be invited to take part in the Australian Human Rights Commission's launch of the Equal Identities report — a landmark piece of research highlighting the experiences, challenges, and barriers facing trans and gender-diverse people across Australian society. Jackie spoke as part of the launch panel, sharing insights from our community and reinforcing the need for action to address the issues raised in the report.

We knew this report needed to be read by the people with power to bring it to life, so following the launch, we mobilised community members to deliver the report directly to their MPs. We kicked this off with a webinar unpacking the findings of the report, explaining why it mattered, and providing practical training on how to meet with elected representatives.

We did it!

With the help of **Ethical Jobs** and our community, we raised more than \$13,000 for our trans health campaign!

Collaboration with Ethical Jobs

In April, we were excited to be invited to partner with Ethical Jobs. They generously committed to matching all donations for one week up to \$6,000 — a target our community not only reached but exceeded.



 **May 2026**

Protecting the Sex Discrimination Act

May 2026 saw big highs and heartbreaking lows, with a landmark legal win followed by a vicious backlash from anti-equality politicians seeking to strip away trans people's protection under the Sex Discrimination Act.



Supporting Roxanne Tickle and her historic case

On the 16 of May the Full Federal Court ruled in favour of trans woman Roxanne Tickle, upholding the right of trans women to be treated equally under discrimination law.

Trans Justice Project continued our support for Roxy and Grata Fund, collaborating on strategy, content, and media.



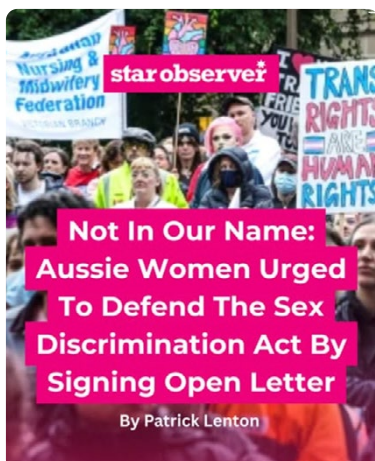
Protecting the Sex Discrimination Act

Following Roxy's remarkable legal win, anti-trans politicians like Angus Taylor and Pauline Hanson saw an opportunity to attack our community once more, introducing multiple bills in Parliament seeking to revoke trans and gender diverse people's protections under the Sex Discrimination Act.

But we mobilised swiftly to ensure that the bills had no chance of passing in Parliament and becoming law. Alongside partners including Equality Australia and Grata Fund, we launched a rapid response campaign to defend the Sex Discrimination Act from attempts to weaken it.

Together, we mobilised supporters to write to and meet with their MPs, and coordinated an open letter signed by more than 60 organisations calling on decision-makers to resist proposed changes.

While this fight is not over we are continuing to push MP's to reject any changes that would impact our rights under the Sex Discrimination Act.



Not In Our Name Australia

We were proud to support the formation of [Not In Our Name Women \(NION\)](#) Australia — a new collective of women standing in solidarity with trans and gender-diverse communities and challenging attempts to use women's rights as a justification for rolling back protections for others.

NION Australia is modelled off of the highly successful NION UK collective, which attracted support from hundreds of thousands of women who refused to allow feminism and the fight against gender-based violence to be weaponised against trans women.

JIMPA Screenings for IDAHOBIT

To mark the International Day Against Homophobia, Biphobia, Intersexism, and Transphobia (IDAHOBIT) Trans Justice Meanjin partnered with Unquiet Collective to host a screening of Jimpa. Jimpa is a powerful new impact film from Sophie Hyde and features actors Olivia Coleman, Kate Box, Aud Mason-Hyde, and John Lithgow. The film is a wonderful celebration of queer and trans joy, relationships and the complexity of our lives.

In Sydney, the wonderful Kate Clugston organised a screening in support of TJP, where Jackie spoke about our work and the importance of building a strong movement for trans justice.

Trans Justice Organising Trainings

From March to June we brought our Trans Justice Organising Training to communities across the country with events in Cairns, Brisbane, Sydney, Canberra, Adelaide, and Perth, with Melbourne and Hobart planned for July and August.

This one day training covers essential skills in organising, campaigning, action planning, and conversations. Most importantly it gives participants a chance to build relationships with people in their community and get involved in their local action group.

Training events like this are transformative. Participants might attend the training unsure of

what they have to offer but leave with the skills, relationships, and confidence they need to make a difference.

As part of the training we support leaders with coaching, workshop outlines, and they get to build their skills as facilitators and activist educators.

We are expecting more than 150 people to have participated in our one day training by the end of August.

Trans Justice Adelaide

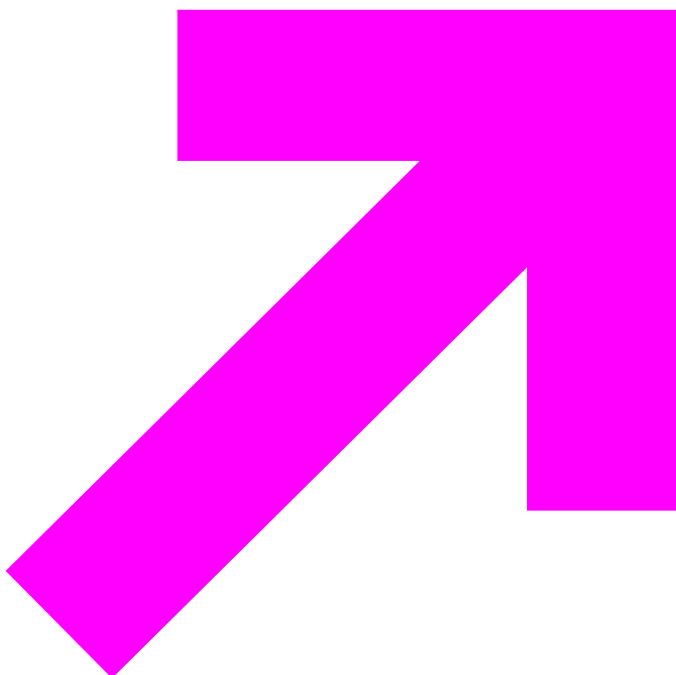
Trans Justice Adelaide was highly active over the last year meeting regularly, speaking in the media, organising a number of events, and running important campaigns to protect trans health care. To get involved find them on [instagram](#) and sign up for updates.

Together they attended events like the Adelaide Pride March, organised multiple picnic and community meetups, have been deeply involved in organising events at the University of Adelaide and Flinders University, and have done countless speaking engagements at events across the region.

The group ran a strong campaign in the lead up to the South Australian election, meeting with candidates, educating the public about the policies of different parties, and following up with successful candidates after the election to discuss how they can support the trans community. Additionally, they participated in an online election forum, 'Body Politics', organised in coalition with a range of other organisations.

A number of members attended an online training to build their skills in speaking to media with the Economic Media Centre. As a result of this training several activists have been quoted and interviewed by various media outlets, most notably after the IDAHOBIT protest by anti-LGBTIQA+ protestors at Reynella East R-12 College.

Finally in March Trans Justice Adelaide started a letter campaign to SA Health calling on them to honour their published commitment to Gender Affirming care and Flinders Medical Centre. To date more than 540 letters have been sent.



 **June 2026**

Launching the Trans Justice Organising Fellowship 2026

Trans Justice Organising Fellowship

A free 6-week online course for up to 25 participants which will empower you with the skills, knowledge, and relationships you need to make real change in your community for trans justice.

Trans justice project

After the success of our 2024 Organising Fellowship, we were thrilled to bring the program back for another year. We selected 27 trans and gender-diverse people to take part in our six-week training program across June and July, focused on building skills in leadership, storytelling, campaign strategy, and growing collective power.

The program is entirely online, with one two-hour workshop a week for six weeks. This goes into more depth than our one day training, and covers some more challenging topics.

One of the benefits of this model is that participants have time to develop deep friendships with each other over the six weeks. That process of building trust and learning together creates a much more impactful experience than we can create in the one day training.

The impact of the Fellowship continues far beyond the training itself. Members of our first cohort have gone on to lead Trans Justice Network groups, contribute to national actions, and take on vital roles across the movement.
